Loyalists of Chaleur Bay



Myers, John of Richmond, gunmaker. He joined the Army at Portsmouth in August 1775.

Claim sworn New Carlisle, Bay of Chaleur, 1786, for a house and lot; an apothecary's shop and equipment; stock and tools; 5 negroes. Note of Inquisition for a lot in Richmond and five slaves, 17 September 1778; later stayed. Rejected.

Claimant Sworn:

Says he left New York in August, 1783, & came to Quebec. In Sept. he saw the Act in the Newspapers, but did not send a Claim

home nor ever claimed until 1785. He says the want of proper evidence prevented his sending a Claim Home.
